Concerning the Determination of the Tri-junction Point

Between Fiji, the French Republic (Wallis and Futuna) and Tuvalu

The three Delegations,

NOTING the negotiations between Fiji, Tuvalu and the French Republic concerning their maritime boundaries,

RECALLING the Agreement between the Government of the Republic of France and the Government of Fiji relating to the Delimitation of their Economic Zone, done in Suva on 19 January 1983, and the Codicil modifying the Agreement of 19 January 1983 between the Government of the French Republic and the Government of Fiji relating to the Delimitation of their Economic Zone, done in Suva on 8 November 1990,

RECALLING the Exchange of Notes between France and Tuvalu constituting an Agreement concerning Provisional Maritime Delimitation between the Two Countries, done on 6 August 1985 and 5 November 1985,

DESIRING to determine the location of the tri-junction point between Fiji, the French Republic (Wallis and Futuna), and Tuvalu,

RECORD THE FOLLOWING AGREED MINUTES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The tri-junction point between Fiji, the French Republic (Wallis and Futuna) and Tuvalu shall be equidistant from the nearest points on the coasts of Fiji, the French Republic (Wallis and Futuna) and Tuvalu.
- 2. The tri-junction point between Fiji, the French Republic (Wallis and Futuna) and Tuvalu shall be the point defined by the following coordinates:

Latitude	Longitude
13° 14′ 27.28″ S	179° 32′ 05.12″ E

- 3. The geographical coordinates referred to in this Article are expressed in terms of the World Geodetic System 1984 (WGS84).
- 4. The point described in paragraph 1 of this Article is drawn for illustrative purposes on the chart forming Annex A to this Agreement.


